Participating in Annual Giving is completely voluntary but we hope to reach 100% participation from all Kenter families. You can absolutely give less than \$1400 per child and we hope every family at Kenter gives what they can. Every donation is important.

This is a public school, why am I asked to donate?

While we are funded by LAUSD as a public school, the staff, teachers and families at Kenter Canyon hold our school to a higher standard on many fronts. We want to provide Kenter students with programs that aren't available in your typical LAUSD public school.

Is every penny donated to KCPSG spent on Kenter Canyon Charter Elementary School?

Every single penny raised by KCPSG is spent on our school and our children! Everything from small requirements such as insurance to large game-changing decisions like class size reduction and technology investments. Typically, more than 90% is spent on program expenses that benefit students directly, and less than 10% is spent on administrative expenses to run these programs.
